Charles is being cared for at [The University of Texas M. D. Anderson Cancer Center](#) in Houston. M. D. Anderson ranks as one of the world's most respected centers focused on cancer patient care, research, education and prevention. The institution is one of only 40 comprehensive cancer centers designated by the National Cancer Institute. For six of the past eight years, including 2009, M. D. Anderson has ranked No. 1 in cancer care in "America's Best Hospitals," a survey published annually in U.S. News & World Report.
