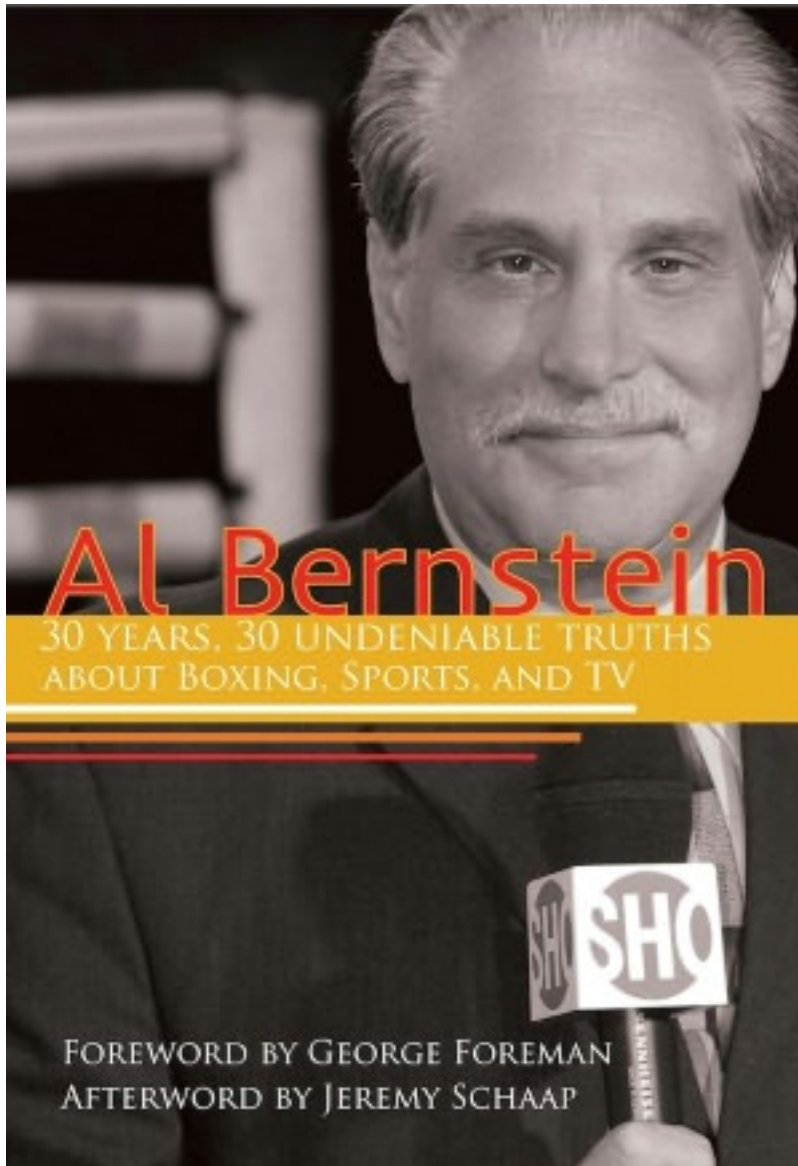


Al Bernstein's New Book Is Out!
