"Ishida beat James Kirkland in a middleweight bout and his last fight was against Pirog, one of the top middleweights in the world. He's very popular in Japan, Asia and Europe and we've had a lot of international interest.

"Our plan is to stay at 160 until a more attractive fight presents itself either at 154 or 168."

"We've had very strong support in New York City from boxing fans and the Kazakh Consulate there and look forward to fighting there in the future."

"While we are focused on making Gennady a household name in the United States, he would have no problem facing Sergio Martinez in Argentina."

When asked about the Canelo Alvarez vs. Austin Trout winner, Loeffler stated,

"For the winner of Canelo vs. Trout, Gennady would have no problem fighting either at 154."

"There is an excellent chemistry between Gennady and his trainer Abel Sanchez, it's great to watch in the gym as well as in the ring. Gennady has been very accepting of Abel's direction."
