Brazilian light heavyweight knockout artist Marcus "Happy" Oliveira (22-1-1, 22 KOs), from Sao Paulo, will face hard-punching spoiler Adam "Atom Bomb" Collins (11-5, 8 KOs), from Portsmouth, Ohio, while another light heavyweight, Azea "Haitian Hitman" Augustama (12-1, 7 KOs), from Miami, will take on 23-year-old Grover Young (6-6-1, 3 KOs), from Memphis, Tenn.

"I am happy to be fighting in the United States," Oliveira said. "I am from Brazil and have fought there and in other places, but this is the best country in the world. South Florida has very large Brazilian population and they will all be out to support me."
